whatever way we can. God often shows up in ways that don't make headlines—through kindness, patience, shared stories, and communities that look out for one another. Out here, we know something about that kind of care.

Thank you for all the ways you contribute to this congregation—whether it's baking, shovelling, calling someone who's had a tough week, or simply showing up when you can. It all matters. It all adds to the light we share.

May this season bring you warmth in the cold, hope and peace in the waiting, and joy and love that slips in quietly but stays for a long while.
